

DOCTRINES, WHAT IS SIN? - 5

Rom 6:23

1 John 3:4

Strong's - OT:2398 chata' (khaw-taw'); a primitive root; properly, to miss; hence (figuratively and generally) to sin; by inference, to forfeit, lack, expiate, repent, (causatively) lead astray, condemn:

KJV - bear the blame, cleanse, commit [sin], by fault, harm he hath done, loss, miss, (make) offend (-er), offer for sin, purge, purify (self), make reconciliation, (cause, make) sin (-ful, -ness), trespass.

BDB - OT:2398 chata' — to sin, to miss, to miss the way, to go wrong, to incur guilt, to forfeit, to purify from uncleanness.

a) (Qal)

- 1) to miss
- 2) to sin, to miss the goal or path of right and duty
- 3) to incur guilt, to incur penalty by sin, to forfeit

b) (Piel)

- 1) to bear loss
- 2) to make a sin-offering
- 3) to purify from sin
- 4) to purify from uncleanness

c) (Hiphil)

- 1) to miss the mark
- 2) to induce to sin, to cause to sin
- 3) to bring into guilt or condemnation or punishment

d) (Hithpael)

- 1) to miss oneself, to lose oneself, to wander from the way
- 2) to purify oneself from uncleanness
